SCOPE OF DUTIES

The Chief Compliance Officer has oversight authority of the Ohio Society to ensure compliance with the Sarbanes-Oxley Act. He documents formal certification of the internal controls, procedures and processes of the Ohio Society to ensure it is in compliance with the Sarbanes- Oxley Act; works with the Ohio Society Audit Committee, provides assistance to the Chairman of the Audit Committee; works with the Ohio Society Ethics Committee, provides assistance to the Chairman of the Ethics Committee; coordinates with the Chancellor and the Treasurer as needed; coordinates compliance efforts with respect to legislative and regulatory developments affecting OHSSAR governance; keeps the Board of Management and the Executive Committee informed about governance law, trends, issues, and best practices; and reports to the Executive Committee all material developments and concerns regarding governance practices, issues and requirements, whether raised internally or externally.
