## State Chaplain's Activity Report

Report from State Chaplain The Rev. Dr. Ed Bonniwell

- 1. I am intentionally seeking to elevate the office and position of Chaplain in our local chapters. I have devised study programs and ways to get men ordained, seeking to hone their skills so that they might better promote the morale of the chapter, Godliness and love for Country. Encouraging them to be faithful and loyal to SAR. These newly ordained men, most recently Matt Hardman, are also being credentialed by the State with all rights and privileges afforded to clergy. In the Colonial Revolutionary War General Washington, and second in command, General Nathaniel Greene highly revered the role of Chaplains. All such credentialed Chaplains were given the rank of Colonel; and of the 225 Chaplains that served in the Colonial Army, 25 died in battle or from wounds. With few exceptions the Chaplains were soldier-Chaplains that carried weapons. They greatly promoted the morale of the army and modeled for them a strength of character and a commitment to liberty that inspired many soldiers to remain and fight. An SAR Chaplain who understands his role can have a significant influence on many men in a non-sectarian way.
- 2. I continue to take the Chaplain's Conference Call Program forward, working on speakers and establishing dates. This past year we enjoyed Steve Brown of Key Life Radio Broadcast who spoke on Post-Modernism, Samuel Davis, who is the George Washington for many groups up and down the East Coast, another amazing guest was Federal Judge Susan Dlott, and Gerhard Maroscher spoke on his newly published book titled, "Why Can't Somebody Just Die Around Here", subtitled "A Story of War, Deprivation, Courage, Perseverance, and Triumph". Which did much to strengthen our love for our freedom and the values that we espouse as SAR members.

- 3. Since assuming my position of State Chaplain thus far we've lost nearly 50 men. President Lee Wilkerson has agreed with me that memorializing our deceased members in our Service of Remembrance through Zoom teleconferencing would not be appropriate, and would be bad form. The current service is attached, but not all names are duly noted. When the anticipated service is executed there will be no preaching, only liturgy and prayers, and the calling of each individual's name.
- 4. I write bereavement letters and contact many families where there is sickness or death. Recently Russell Simmons, age 91, a member of the Cincinnati Chapter slipped away. My letters to his wife and daughter resulted with the oldest daughter calling me Sunday night July 5<sup>th</sup>, and we subsequently received a \$500 check for the Cincinnati Chapter. Moreover, I have elicited the help of newly ordained Matt Hardman as my assistant, because there are times when I must travel in order to fulfill my responsibilities. I greatly value the personal connection that I get to have with so many amazing people.
- 5. In my daily walk I take seriously the call to "study to show thyself approved unto God" and to model the charity that is befitting of a true Chaplain. It's not unusual for me to call and pray with various men given the issues and struggles that frequently befall us in this life. I find my involvement with SAR most fulfilling, and am grateful to God that in this season of my life I have health and can be so involved. I love preaching and preach three times a week in my own church. And am willing to do so for SAR when opportunities present themselves. However, many of our men have their own sectarian affiliations and are advantaged by the clergy in their own particular religious traditions. Nevertheless, when called upon, I'm willing to give such homilies, etc. without hesitation.
- 6. To my mind, we are somewhat paramilitary; I believe in being under authority, and do my best to seek approval, direction, and input from my superiors. Especially from Lee Wilkerson, Don McGraw, Greg Ballman, and Dr. Michael Gunn. These are unique men and good models for all of us.
- 7. I am introducing a new reading program, and will subsequently publish a biography based on the materials that our presenters use in the public schools. I am proud to be a part of an ever-growing team which thus far has spoken to 6700 students.
- 8. Prayer needs from Chaplain Bonniwell:
  - Pray for our President Lee Wilkerson, being assisted by Dr. Ed Bonniwell, Bob Hill, and Assistant State Chaplain, Matt Hardman, as he navigates the Ohio State Board Education. A second meeting is forthcoming and we need both favor and wisdom. We were well received in our initial presentation. This endorsement would advantage every chapter in the State.
  - Pray always for the safety of our members, especially people of the Color Guard firing weapons.
